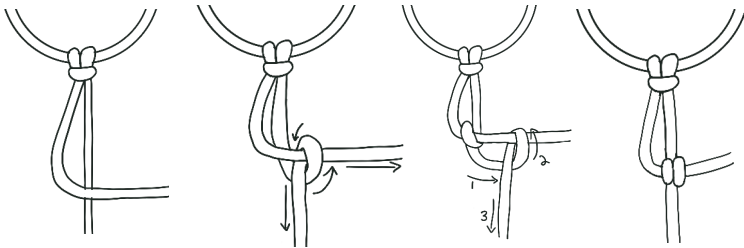


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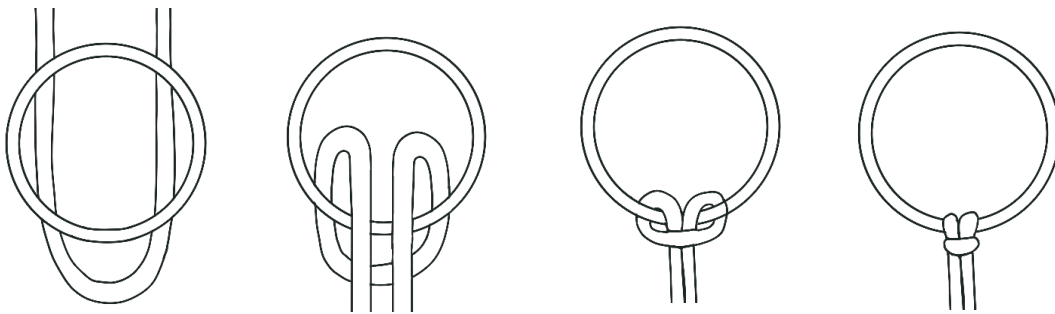
Double half hitch knot:



Supplies:

- Keychain
- Scissors
- Tape
- 3 mm braided cord at these lengths:
 - 20" long (x2)
 - 52" long (x3)

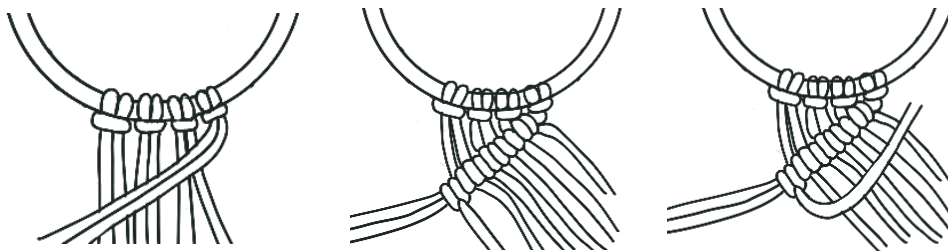
Step 1: Secure your keychain to a corkboard, or tape it to your work surface.



Step 2: Attach your 52" cord to the key ring using lark's head knots (shown above). Then, attach the 20" cord all the way to the right.

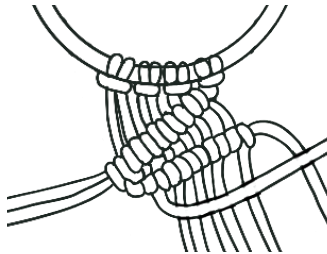
Step 3: Bring the two cords from the far right across the other cords at an angle. These will become your filler cord. Use the other cords to tie two knots (each) across your filler cord from right to left.

Step 4: Take the third cord from the left. Lay it across the other cords at an angle. Then, use each cord to tie two knots (each) across the filler cord, left to right.

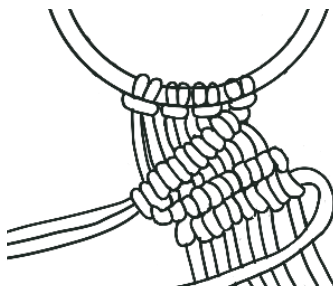


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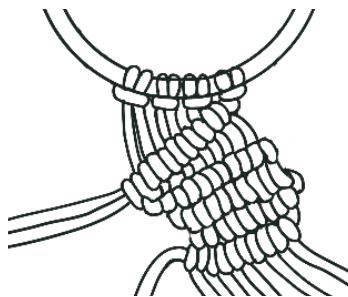
Step 5: Again, take the third cord from the left and lay it across the other cords at an angle. Repeat the motion, tying two knots each, left to right.



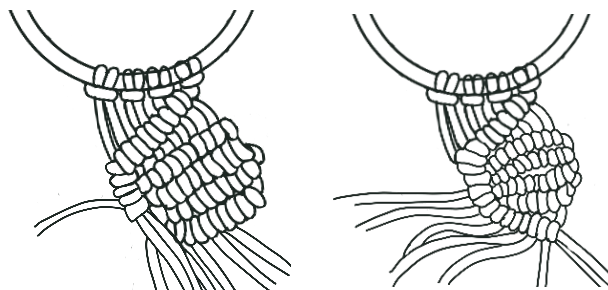
Step 6: Use the farthest cord to the right as the filler cord and repeat the knot-tying pattern, right to left.



Step 7: Repeat step 6.

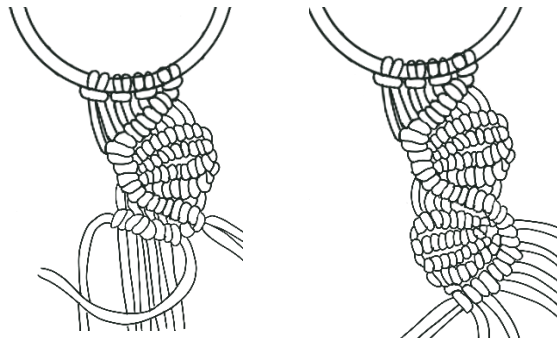


Step 8: Pick up the original two filler cords and tie a row of knots around the bottom of the leaf, left to right. The first knot will cinch up the space on the left, so pull tightly to get it in the right spot.

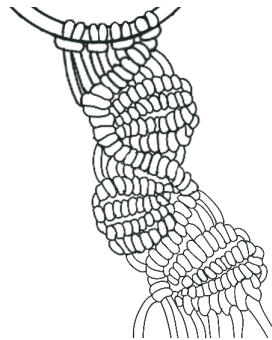


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Step 9: Repeat steps 4 through 7, alternating directions. The two original filler cords will form a snake shape down the middle.



Step 10: Repeat steps 4 through 7.



Step 11: Finish off the vine. Pick up the two filler cords on the left and tie one knot to cinch up the leaf.

Step 12: Before making the next knot, add the working cord you just used to your filler cords. Tie the knot around all three cords.

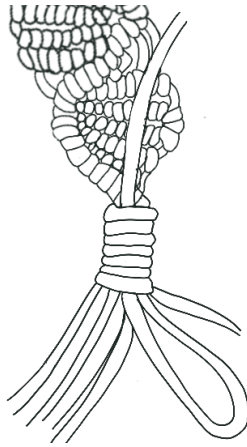
Step 13: Repeat with each knot, moving to the right.



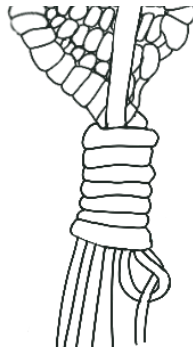
Step 14: Pick up the other 20" cord. Fold it into a U shape and hold it against the bundle of cords at the bottom.

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Step 15: Wrap the long end of the cord around the bundle 7 times. Then, thread the working end through the loop out to the bottom.



Step 16: Pull the top piece of cord and bring the loop up halfway through the wraps.



Step 17: Cut off the excess cord from the wrapping knot and poke the ends with your scissors. Cut the fringe, and you're done!
